The Portland action group of Friends of Sabeel--North America in collaboration with over 20 regional church mission groups, non-profit organizations and educational groups will host an important conference on the subject of the Israel / Palestine conflict. The conference titled "Seeds of Justice and Hope for Palestinians and Israelis: What is required of US" will be held at the First United Methodist Church in Portland, April 4th and 5th.

Anastas and her family have spent fourteen years trapped between Israeli politics and Palestinian infighting, experiencing the worst of the intifadas and consequential building of the security/separation wall around her house, close to checkpoint 300.

Toll continues, "The education that takes place at theses conferences has greatly influenced the churches and concerned people of all faiths. The ongoing military occupation of the West Bank and Gaza is hurting Israel as well as Palestinians and must come to an end."
